



Over £1,000 received so far for Victim Support Dorset through charity hike

Soldiers from the Royal Signals Regiment based at Blandford Camp walked and ran the length of Hadrian's Wall, raising over £1,000 for Victim Support Dorset.

Three of the soldiers ran the distance of 84 miles in just 21 hours, starting on Saturday 3rd June and finishing on Sunday. That is the equivalent of over three marathons!



Another 16 soldiers hiked the distance along Hadrian's Wall, starting on Thursday 1st June and finishing on Sunday 4th June at 2pm.

Victim Support Dorset has already received over £1,000 through money raised by staff, volunteers and trustees with more still to come.
